Professor Asgar Ali KallaPresident of AFLAR 2019 – 2023.

Professor Asgar Ali Kalla graduated from the University of Cape Town (UCT). South Africa in 1975. He completed his training as a general physician at Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital, Soweto, South Africa in 1979. He completed his training as a rheumatologist at the University of Cape Town in 1985. He subsequently completed his doctorate (MD) at the University of Cape Town in 1989 on Osteoporosis in Rheumatoid Arthritis. He has been Professor of Rheumatology at the University of Cape Town from 2001 until his retirement in December 2017. He is currently Professor Emeritus in the Department of Medicine, University of Cape Town, Cape Town, South Africa. He has trained over 1,000 general physicians in Rheumatology rotations over the years. Many of the rheumatologists in South Africa and other parts of Africa have been trained under his supervision. He has visited rheumatology units at several South African universities and lectured to medical residents in South Africa, Uganda, Ethiopia and Kenya. He has had a long interest in Lupus research, mainly around the effects of corticosteroids on bone mineral density. Professor Kalla represented the African continent in the study on global health issues in Rheumatology, with Dr A Briggs from Canada. Professor Kalla has pioneered a number of initiatives within AFLAR and has played a key role in several publications of research from AFLAR in the last 3 years. His research interests span a wide range of subjects including RA, SLE, osteoporosis, and Gout. He served on the Executive of ILAR for the last 3 years and is currently President of AFLAR. He co-ordinated a number of AFLAR and ILAR related events. Professor Kalla is the current Chief-Editor of the AFLAR Journal of Rheumatology. He has been instrumental in the development of a series of sub-committees within AFLAR, including the Lupus Interest Group, and continues to enhance the development of Rheumatology as a vibrant subspeciality of Internal Medicine within South Africa and on the continent of Africa.









Professor Anthony D Woolf, FRCP

Consultant Rheumatologist Director, Bone and Joint Research Group, Royal Cornwall Hospital, Truro, UK

Professor Anthony Woolf is a consultant rheumatologist and Director, of the Bone and Joint Research Group, Royal Cornwall Hospital, Truro, UK. and has held honorary chairs in Rheumatology at the University of Exeter Medical School, Plymouth University Peninsula Schools of Medicine and Dentistry, and visiting Professor in Musculoskeletal Science, Faculty of Medicine, Lund University, Sweden. He was Clinical Director, National Institute of Health Research (NIHR) Clinical Research Network South West Peninsula until 2019 with responsibility of delivering clinical research across the southwest health system.

Dr. Woolf has past and present leading positions within various national, European and International organisations – Chair Bone and Joint Decade Foundation; Co- Chair and founder member of the Global Alliance for Musculoskeletal Health; past member of European League Against EULAR Executive Committee as chair of the Education and Training Standing Committee and International Liaison Officer; past President UEMS / European Board of Rheumatology; and Past Chair, Arthritis and Musculoskeletal Alliance UK;. He edited Best Practice and Research Clinical Rheumatology for over 20 years and has served on the editorial boards of several other journals. He has published over 200 peer review papers, 81 editorials and reviews, 61 chapters and written or edited 28 books and reports.

He works with and advises policymakers in the European Commission and WHO on musculoskeletal health issues, in particular disability, ageing, noncommunicable diseases and health in the workplace. He works with NHS England, Public Health England and Department of Work and Pensions to ensure musculoskeletal health is in all policies – health, social and employment. He advised WHO Europe on including musculoskeletal health in the Noncommunicable Disease Action Plan 2016 – 2026 and WHO Geneva on the World Report on Ageing and Health. He is currently working with policy makers and employers in England and Europe, including advising the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work, to reduce the impact that musculoskeletal conditions have on people's ability to work and in an ageing population.









Professor Girish M. Mody

Born in Durban and a graduate of the University of KwaZulu-Natal, in Durban, South Africa

He was appointed as the first Aaron Beare Family Professor of Rheumatology at the University in October 1992 and served as Head of the Department until his retirement in December 2021. He served as President of the South African Rheumatism and Arthritis Association (1990-1992), President of AFLAR (1999-2003) and member of the exco of ILAR from 1995 to 2003. He developed a centre of excellence for rheumatology training in Durban and over 20 doctors from Nigeria, Kenya, Sudan and Ethiopia have obtained part of their training in Durban.

He was honoured by the ACR in 2015 when he became the first AFRICAN RHEUMATOLOGIST to be elected as a Fellow of the ACR.

She completed her Rheumatology and Clinical Research training in Rheumatology at University College London Hospitals, London under the mentorship and tutelage of Prof David Isenberg and a Masters in Rheumatology at Kings College, London. She was a Research Fellow of the Cardiovascular Research Training Institute (CaRT) - New York University/NIH program and pursuing a Masters in Medical education. She is currently





a Senior Lecturer at University of Ghana Medical School, Consultant Rheumatologist and Head of Rheumatology at the Korle- bu Teaching Hospital Ghana.

Her career has been dedicated to developing rheumatology in Ghana and across Africa as the pioneer rheumatologist who set up the first clinic in 2009 and serving as the Secretary General of the African League against Rheumatism. She also serves on several international committees. She has been recognised in Ghana as a Hero of Change 2018(MTN), and achievements by the Royal College of Physicians, London for International Women's Day and won the first Distinguished International Health Professional Award from the American College of Rheumatology ACR in 2021.

Douglas White, MD, PhD earned his MD and PhD degrees from the University of Iowa, followed by residency training in Internal Medicine at Parkland Hospital (UT-Southwestern) and fellowship training in rheumatology at Barnes-Jewish Hospital (Washington University in St. Louis) all in the United States.



Prof. Omondi Oyoo is an Associate Professor in the Department of Clinical Medicine and Therapeutics, School of Medicine, University of Nairobi. He is also the Head of rheumatology unit at the Kenyatta National Hospital in Nairobi, Kenya.

Currently pursuing PhD in Pharmacology in the department of Pharmacy at the University of Nairobi, Prof.Oyoo received both his undergraduate and Master's Degree in Internal Medicine at the same institution. His Master's thesis focused on clinical and socio-demographic features in patients with congestive heart failure. His PhD work is looking at influencers of treatment response among patients with rheumatoid arthritis.
