Dr Ganda is a seasoned administrator with 18 years of experience spanning from management of a level four hospital before rising the ranks to become the County

Director of Health then transitioning to be the head of clinical services of the largest teaching and referral hospital in Kisumu County.

In his current assignment as the Minister of Health, he is responsible for overseeing health service delivery and administration in one of the largest counties in Western Kenya with a population of about 1.2 million. He leads the Department's vision and provides policy direction for the Kisumu County Department of Health. He serves as the link of the Department to the Executive, strategically advising His Excellency the Governor on emerging health matters including decisions and investments that need to be made.

Dr Ganda has overseen the implementations of pioneer programs in Kisumu County: the Social Health Insurance scheme dubbed Marwa, Primary Health Care modeling for all the 7 sub-counties, digitalization of community health systems (eCHIS) and most recently the setup of a safe motherhood digital ecosystem dubbed safemama tech. He is an ardent believer in digitalization, technology use, systems interoperability, out-of-the-box thinking and innovation to improve work processes and data flow, patient outcomes and reduced turnaround time.

He currently co-chairs the Health Information Research Monitoring and Evaluation (HIRME) Intergovernmental Technical Working Group, is a member of the National Cancer Taskforce advocating for increased access to comprehensive cancer and the Director in Kenya's Digital Health Agency providing perspectives from a devolved government angle on the Digital Transformation Agenda For Health.

He earned his Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBChB) and Master of Medicine In Internal Medicine (MMed) from the University of Nairobi, where he is currently pursuing a PhD in Pharmacology. His MMed thesis focused on clinical and socio-demographic features in Patients with congestive heart failure. His doctoral research focuses on identifying treatment Response influencers among patients with rheumatoid arthritis. He further specialized in Rheumatology through training programs at Tel Aviv University (Israel), Tulane University (USA), Louisiana State University (USA), University of Cape Town (South Africa), and the University Of Aberdeen (UK).

Prof. Oyoo is a fellow of the American college of rheumatology, a fellow of the East and Central Africa College of physicians, a member of the British Society for Rheumatology and a Fellow of The Royal college of Physicians of Edinburgh. In April 2023, the Council of the Royal college of Physicians, Edinburgh approved the appointment of Prof Oyoo to the position of the Regional Adviser for Kenya for five years due to finish at the end of March 2028.

In his academic role at the University of Nairobi, Prof. Oyoo teaches and supervises both Undergraduate and postgraduate students. He has mentored over 60 master's and PhD candidates,

And he plays a critical role in curriculum development and postgraduate examinations. He also Leads national rheumatology training initiatives through the Uwezo Rheumatology Foundation, Which he founded and chairs.

Her clinical and academic interests include the management of patients with systemic lupus erythematosus and the integration of musculoskeletal ultrasound (MSK US) in routine rheumatology practice. Dr. Melong Taleng is passionate about improving rheumatologic care and capacity across Africa, with a particular focus on ultrasound as a low-cost, high-impact diagnostic and training tool, as well as on improving the quality of life of people living with lupus and advancing research in this field.

She is an active member of several international rheumatology networks. She currently serves as Chair of the Young African Rheumatologists' Network (YARN) within AFLAR, and is a former member of the Peer Mentoring Sub-Committee of EMEUNET, the emerging network of the European Alliance of Associations for Rheumatology (EULAR). She also contributes to the OMERACT group working on lupus recommendations, promoting evidence-based care for patients worldwide.

In addition to her clinical work, she is actively involved in medical education, the development of rheumatology training programs, and has participated in several research projects through global collaborations.

Dr Gurveen Soin is a Consultant Physician and Rheumatologist, having completed her MMed (Internal Medicine) at the University of Cape Town and Fellowship at the college of medicine South Africa (FCP SA) as well as her MPhil and subspecialist Rheumatology training at Stellenbosch University and Tygerberg Hospital in South Africa.

Her clinical and academic passion lies in the field of rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases (RMDs), particularly interstitial lung disease (ILD) associated with connective tissue disease. Her MMed research described the clinical characteristics of ILD patients attending a tertiary institution, while her MPhil focused on patients with Interstitial Pneumonia with Autoimmune Features (IPAF), offering one of the first descriptive studies of this population in Africa.

Dr Soin has presented her ILD research at international conferences including the American Thoracic Society (ATS) and the Australian Rheumatology Association (ARA), and she has authored editorials on ILD nomenclature in the African Journal of Thoracic and Critical Care Medicine, as well achieving the Phil Robertson Scholarship Award at ACR 2024.

Her broader aim is to enhance multi-disciplinary, evidence-based approaches to CTD- ILD management within rheumatology across sub-Saharan Africa.


